Membership: We achieved our membership goal for 2011-2012 and have a great start for 2012-2013 which begins with this newsletter. Our member survey provided us with the information we need to shape the Council, as the Knights of Columbus requires and our members' desires. CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Supreme Chaplain Bishop William E. Lori

Allowing the Word of God to Shape Us

Celebrating his first Mass in St. Mary's Church in New Haven since being installed as the head of the Archdiocese of Baltimore on May 16, Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori urged Knights of Columbus state deputies to allow the Word of God to shape their hearts and minds so they may become exemplary leaders for the faith and for the Order.

When reading the Bible or listening to the Scripture readings at Mass, Archbishop Lori said, "We should remind ourselves that it is truly the inspired Word of God and, therefore, we should have only one goal: to find Christ and to hear his voice, to allow his heart to speak to our heart. ... The Scriptures are, in written form, God's one word, his only Son, through whom he created us and through whom he redeemed us."

He added, the Word of God should "shape how we think, what we believe, how we worship, what decisions we make, and indeed, how we participate in the mission of the Knights of Columbus."

At the end of Mass, before blessing the ceremonial jewels of office for the newly elected state deputies, Archbishop Lori prayed that the Order's leaders would "confirm and strengthen" their brother Knights and their families in the faith, in keeping with God's word. The newly elected state deputies then came forward with their wives for Supreme Knight Carl Anderson to confer the ceremonial jewels.



Pope Presents Pallium to Supreme Chaplain Archbishop Lori

On the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, June 29, Pope Benedict XVI presented a pallium to each one of 44 new archbishops appointed during the last year, including the Supreme Chaplain, Archbishop William E. Lori, who was installed as the sixteenth Archbishop of Baltimore on May 16.

A pallium is the white, woolen vestment worn around the neck of metropolitan archbishops who lead an ecclesiastical province composed of an archdiocese and one or more smaller dioceses or "suffragans" – e.g. the Province of Baltimore is comprised of the Archdiocese of Baltimore and its suffragan dioceses of

Arlington, Richmond, Wheeling-Charleston, and Wilmington.

Symbolizing the light yoke of Christ while also recalling a lamb borne upon the shoulders of a shepherd, the pallium is the premier symbol of an archbishop's pastoral ministry, jurisdiction, and communion with the Apostolic See.

Each pallium is woven from wool sheared from lambs blessed annually on the feast of Saint Agnes, January 21. The vestment is punctuated by five black crosses (red crosses in the case of the petrine pallium), which represent the five wounds of Christ. Pins are inserted into three of the crosses, representing the nails of the crucifixion.

On the eve of the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, the pallia to be distributed are placed atop the tomb of Saint Peter where they remain overnight until the ceremony of conferral the next day, further emphasizing the vestment's connection to Saint Peter and his successors.

Among the 44 new archbishops were 11 other members of the Knights of Columbus, including: Cardinal Francisco Robles Ortega of Guadalajara, Mexico; Archbishop Charles Chaput of Philadelphia; Archbishop-designate Samuel Aquila of Denver; Archbishop William Skurla of Pittsburgh of the Byzantines; Archbishop Luc Cyr of Sherbrooke, Canada; Archbishop Valery Vienneau of Moncton, Canada; Archbishop Christian Lepine of Montreal, Canada; Archbishop Paul-André Durocher of Gatineau, Canada; Archbishop Luis Antonio Tagle of Manila, Philippines; Archbishop Jose Advincula of Capiz, Philippines; and Archbishop Romulo Geolina Valles of Davao, Philippines.

Spring Blood Drive

We saved 180 lives as results of our blood drive in June. 48 whole blood units plus 6 double (12 units) were donated by the council, St. John the Evangelist parishioners, and other friends throughout the community. There were 75 appointment and 5 walk-ins. Many thanks to Pete Stankoski, Jim Smith, Bob Cyphers, Tom Zaegel, John Bushman, and Michael Bathon for their support. All did a tremendous job in running a very smooth operation from our end. Unfortunately we had some difficulties with the Red Cross staffing that resulted in excessively long process for many of our donors. Rest assured that these issues were worked out immediately with Red Cross management, but there was not time to rectify the problem as their staff had failed to advise them of the problems in a timely manner. As a result however, we now know what questions to ask and what to know at the beginning in the future so that we can take prompt action if needed with Red Cross Management......even if at 6a.m. on Saturday morning. However, after strongly emphasizing our displeasure, etc., we certainly believe this will not be an issue in future blood drives. We were provided 6 coupons for free tickets to the Oriole games, and will pull names randomly and offer them to those who were impacted by the delays. Sadly we cannot do something for everyone in this case.

The Fortnight for Freedom Campaign

The Fortnight for Freedom Campaign was launched on Thursday June 21 with a special Mass and prayers celebrated by Archbishop (and Supreme Chaplain) Lori with an over capacity crowd at the Basilica.

Why Fortnight For Freedom?

On April 12, the Ad Hoc Committee on Religious Liberty of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) issued a document, Our First, Most Cherished Liberty, outlining the bishops' concerns over threats to religious freedom, both at home and abroad. The bishops called for a "Fortnight for Freedom," a 14-day period of prayer, education and action in support of religious freedom, from June 21-July 4.

Bishops in all dioceses are encouraged to arrange special events to highlight the importance of defending religious freedom. Catholic institutions are encouraged to do the same, especially in cooperation with other Christians, Jews, people of other faiths and all who wish to defend our most cherished freedom.

The fourteen days from June 21—the vigil of the Feasts of St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More—to July 4, Independence Day, are dedicated to this "fortnight for freedom"—a great hymn of prayer for our country. Our liturgical calendar celebrates a series of great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power—St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More, St. John the Baptist, SS. Peter and Paul, and the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome. Culminating on Independence Day, this special period of prayer, study, catechesis, and public action would emphasize both our Christian and American heritage of liberty. Dioceses and parishes around the country could choose a date in that period for special events that would constitute a great national campaign of teaching and witness for religious liberty.

Dear Fathers,

Recently, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty, which I chair, issued a statement on religious liberty, "Our First, Most Cherished Liberty."

The statement cites the growing number of threats to our religious liberty, and calls on Bishops to engage the faithful in insisting that our liberties as Catholics and Americans be respected. "As bishops we seek to bring the light of the Gospel to our public life, but the work of politics is properly that of committed and courageous lay Catholics. We exhort them to be both engaged and articulate in insisting that as Catholics and as Americans we do not have to choose between the two."

To accomplish this goal, the Committee has recommended that we focus our energies this summer on promoting religious freedom. Thus, they have proposed a "Fortnight for Freedom," June 21-July 4.

The Archdiocese of Baltimore has been selected to host the national kick-off event for the Fortnight for Freedom. I will celebrate a Mass for religious liberty at our Basilica of the Assumption in Baltimore on June 21 at 7 p.m. I invite you to concelebrate the Mass with me and hope you'll encourage your parishioners to attend.

In addition to the Mass, the following observances are suggested for your parish to participate in the Fortnight for Freedom:

- Ringing of church bells by parishes throughout the Archdiocese at noon on June 21 and July 4;
- Distribution of prayer card with the Prayer for Religious Freedom, with encouragement to parishioners to pray it daily (cards can be ordered through Catholic Review Media--Call 443-524-3150 or 888-768-9555 to order, \$10/100);
- Preaching on religious freedom at Sunday Masses throughout the Fortnight;

- Inclusion of bulletin inserts the weekends of June 16-17, 23-24 and June 30-July 1;

- Encouraging use of resources by parents and families, found at www.archbalt.org.

Many of the aforementioned resources can be found on our website, while others—including graphics, prayer resources and sample activities can be found at www.fortnight4freedom.org.

Finally, with the coordination of our Respect Life office, several parishes in the Archdiocese have agreed to host "regional" Fortnight events. These are listed on the back of the attached flyer, which you are encouraged to include in your bulletins, and/or print for posting in your parishes. As well, the Communications Office will be sending two 11 x 17 versions of the flyer to each parish. If any parish wishes to add an event, please forward relevant information to communications@archbalt.org and it will be added to our website.

I am most grateful to each of you for your cooperation in this effort. Please join me in praying that it will lead the faithful to a greater awareness of the many threats to our religious liberty, and the obligation we have to staunchly defend this first among all freedoms for ourselves and for future generations of Catholics and Americans of all faiths.




