Saint John Paul II National Shrine Filled with Pilgrims Following National Mass of Thanksgiving in Washington for New Pope Saints

A national celebration of the newly canonized St. John XXIII and St. John Paul II concluded with a procession of several hundred people from the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception to the Saint John Paul II National Shrine on Sunday, May 11.

The procession was led by an honor guard of more than 100 Fourth Degree Knights. Cardinal Donald Wuerl, archbishop of Washington, who served as the principal celebrant and homilist at the Mass, carried the blood relic of St. John Paul II in the procession back to its shrine. Supreme Chaplain, Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore, had previously carried the relic into the Basilica at the start of the Mass.


