

Council Home facility: The Council Home is in better shape than ever and we're already hosting MEMBER sponsored events in the Hall. These events defray operating expenses for the Hall (heat, light, etc.) so that we can focus on charitable gifts with dues and other income. We are getting a lot of interest in the Hall and have already hosted an on-going training program, tailgate parties, a shower, the Red Hats, and Karate classes. The Hall can host up to 60 people for a birthday, anniversary or similar occasion with audio visual capabilities. The sponsor will be responsible for the hall rental donation (\$100), set up and clean up with oversight by a Council Home representative. We do not have a certified kitchen so food must be prepared and brought to the Council Home. Think about hosting your family event at the Council Home and call me to reserve a date.

Communications: The communications discussion has started with review of a draft policy by a special communications team in February. We strive to improve Council Communications to and from members. There are many new communications techniques available that we will use to determine if they will work better than current methods of soliciting inputs.

In Service to One, in Service to All

Pope Benedict XVI has named 22 new cardinals.

Pope Benedict XVI has named 22 new cardinals, including three members of the Knights of Columbus, announcing their formal induction for Feb. 18, at St. Peter's Basilica.

Cardinals are the Holy Father's closest advisors, and those under 80 have the responsibility of electing the pope's successor.

Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson welcomed the news of the appointments and said, "The Knights of Columbus is pleased that these distinguished members of our organization have been selected for this great honor. Their dedication to the Gospel and to the service of the Church is inspiring and provides an excellent example to our members in North America. Together with the 1.8 Knights of Columbus, I congratulate the cardinals-designate and pledge our continued solidarity with them and our Holy Father."

Among those to be elevated to the Sacred College of Cardinals are two Americans and a Canadian, all of whom are members of the Order: Archbishop Timothy M. Dolan of New York; Archbishop Edwin F. O'Brien, Grand Master of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem; and Archbishop Thomas C. Collins of Toronto.

Cardinal-designate Dolan is a native of St. Louis and was ordained a priest of that archdiocese in 1976. During the 1990s he served as a secretary at the Apostolic Nunciature in Washington and rector of the Pontifical North American College, a U.S. seminary in Rome. Pope John Paul II appointed him an auxiliary bishop of St. Louis in 2001 and a year later named him Archbishop of Milwaukee. Pope Benedict XVI appointed him to lead the Archdiocese of New York in 2009. He was elected to the presidency of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops

in 2010.

Cardinal-designate Dolan joined St. Anthony Council 417 in Washington, D.C., in 1980 while a doctoral student at The Catholic University of America. He is also a member of Charles Carroll Assembly 693 in Manhattan.

Cardinal-designate O'Brien was born in New York and ordained a priest for that archdiocese in 1965. He served as a U.S. Army chaplain during the early 1970s and later as both vice-chancellor of the archdiocese and secretary to Cardinals Terence Cooke and John O'Connor. He was rector of St. Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers (Dunwoodie) from 1985-89 and 1994-97. Between those periods he was rector of the North American College in Rome. He was appointed an auxiliary bishop of New York by Pope John Paul II in 1996 and Coadjutor Archbishop for the Military Services U.S.A. in April 1997. He succeeded to that post in August 1997 and served in that role for 10 years until being appointed Archbishop of Baltimore by Pope Benedict XVI in 2007. Late last year the Holy Father named him Pro-Grand Master of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem.

In 1995, the cardinal-designate joined Sisqua Council 1852 in Mount Kisco, N.Y. In 1999, he became a member of Father Nicholas Habets Assembly 1505 in Virginia Beach, V.A.

Cardinal-designate Collins was born in the southwestern Ontario City of Guelph and ordained a priest for the Diocese of Hamilton in 1973. In additional to pastoral duties, he served as a college and seminary professor during his early priesthood, ultimately serving as vice-rector and rector of St. Peter's Seminary in London Ontario during the 1990s. Pope John Paul II appointed him Coadjutor Bishop of Saint Paul in Alberta in 1997. He succeeded to that post later that year and was made Coadjutor Archbishop of Edmonton in February 1999. He succeeded to that post in June of that year and was appointed Archbishop of Toronto by Pope Benedict XVI in December 2006.

The cardinal-designate joined the Order in 1998 and is a member of Toronto Council 1388 and Cardinal McGuigan Assembly 865 (also in Toronto).

Our Family of the Month for February 2012 is also our Family of the Year, Tom and Jane Zaegel. Tom has served the parish in numerous capacities including Parish Council, St John's Finance Committee, Long Term Planning Committee, Capital Campaign committee, and counts collections after masses. He has served as a Eucharistic Minister for over 20 years and currently serves as LGVC Council Liaison with the Parish in his role as Council Program Director.

Janie has also contributed as a leader in the church community. She served as the Knights Ladies Treasurer and President in addition to serving on the parish school board, parish pastoral council, and was a teacher in our Parish school of religion. Janie has also served as Eucharistic Minister for over 20 years.

As Program Director and immediate Past Grand Knight, Tom has revitalized the Activities in all six areas with both improved and new programs. In addition to his current role as Program Director, Tom has also assumed chairmanship of our Council Pro Life Activities this fraternal year. Recently, Tom helped organize and develop a parish group traveling to Annapolis for Lobby Night. The Council rented a bus and collaborated with St John's Respect Life Ministry. Between the organizations, 25 people joined together on the trip. All were registered in advance with Maryland Catholic Conference, journeyed to St Mary's High School in Annapolis for the MCC briefings and then shuttled to the State Legislature to meet with elected officials and express their views.

Tom had a 40 year career in the aviation industry with McDonnell Douglas, Martin Marietta, Lockheed Martin and Middle River Aircraft Systems, a subsidiary of General Electric. Janie had been employed by Becton Dickenson and she currently works for the McCormick Spice Company in Hunt Valley. Janie has been an active participant and coordinator for the "C-day" corporate activity to raising funds for United Way. All of their employers have been exemplary participants in community based activities and Tom and Jane have participated in these outreach programs throughout their careers.

After joining the Long Green Valley Council in 1987, Tom has held a number of Council Leadership positions, up to and including GK. It was the confluence of these experiences that gave Tom the insight into all aspects of parish life and motivated him to lead the Council in an important new, collaborative direction for our Council future.

Tom's most notable achievement for the Knights has been to forge a highly integrated three way relationship between the Council and our Parish and Parish School. Those stronger relationships have created an effective and valuable synergy on the St John's Campus that has brought the entire faith community closer together. Tom has fully achieved this transformation in his current Council position as Program Director.

After he laid the ground work in his previous role as Grand Knight, Tom initiated a significant increase in communication and collaboration between all three Parish organizations. He periodically visits with the Parish Office and School Principal to see what their plans are and determine how the Council might help. He developed close liaisons and then determined opportunities for joint activities that were mutually beneficial to all three parish organizations. Within the Council he created new or improved activity concepts, recruited leaders and workers, then organized and led Council volunteers in support of some Church and parish school activities and functions.

Not only were the church and school grateful for the help of the Knights but they also have increased their participation in Knights' events, including fund raisers. More crucially and fortuitously, the church, based in part upon the close relationship that Tom cultivated, recently agreed to take on the full repair costs for the crumbling Council Home foundation. The cost was prohibitive for us with regard to our Council resources and operating budget. As a result, Tom's relationship building with the church helped rescue the Council from financial hardship or loss of our Council Home on campus.

The Zaegel children are now adults and married, following in their parents' footsteps. Tom and Jane have three grandchildren. Congratulate Tom, and Janie, when you see them.

Lobby Night in Annapolis – Thanks to the leadership of our council, we had a very significant contingency attend the MCC Lobby Night Program this year. It was jointly promoted by the SJE parish Respect Life Ministry. Our council arranged for a bus to transport us there and back. Marriage Law Petition for Referendum

By the time this newsletter is published, the Governor will have signed his bill into law making same sex marriage legal. The bill establishes that only a marriage between two individuals who are not otherwise prohibited from marrying is valid in this State and includes exemptions to accommodate religious groups. House amendments delay the effective date until January 2013 or after any lawsuits over a referendum effort are resolved, if that occurs after January 2013, and provide that any court rulings that invalidate any portion of the law void the entire law.

For those interested, this is part of an email from Don Dwyer who has led the charge for a Constitutional Amendment to the Maryland Constitution defining Marriage as between one man and one woman:

"It will take about 3 weeks before we can begin collecting signatures, in the meantime what you can do is go to https://www.mdpetitions.com, click on "contact" and send an email with the message "I will help with the same sex marriage petitions". This will put you in the loop to receive updates and information once the effort is underway.

This is the official site for the referendum effort, please be forewarned that there may be other efforts underway, but that mdpetitons.com is the official referendum effort backed by Delegate Dwyer.

I have seen on some websites that Ministers in PG County have vowed to petition this bill to referendum and to see that those who voted for it are voted out of office. We have powerful allies!






