CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

From State Chaplain Reverend Milton E. Jordan's column in the February 2015 Maryland State Council newsletter.

My Brother Knights:

How swiftly a single month can pass us by! And even more swiftly is the appearance of that Wednesday colored in purple on the February calendar. Lent is upon us.

During the last few days of January our daily Mass readings have sent forth the message that is significant for all of us, especially that who have taken on the cloak of Knighthood. In several of the gospels there has been a reminder that we have been especially called by God to a unique vocation. "Will you follow me?"

All of the meetings, dinners, and activities we attend every month and throughout the year are opportunities for each of us to respond the vocational call given to us.

In the lead days to Lent, we have the opportunity to be like any good business man: planning for any major event coming our way. Indeed Lent is one of those "major events" the Church gives us each year. These few remaining weeks before Ash Wednesday are time when we should look at ourselves and ask now, not on Ash Wednesday morning, how can I make this Lent a genuine opportunity to strengthen my own faith, my personal commitment to Jesus Christ.

You've read about and heard me speak about the Supreme Knight's desire to see the "Domestic Church" become a matter of concern within each Knight's home. Maybe this is the time to make ready with plans for a serious "family effort" to bring spouses and children together each day for a few minutes of family prayer: a rosary, or at least one decade of the rosary; a reading of the daily gospel for each day of Lent. How about a DVD once a week that would bring you and your family together watching the life of a saint or an instructional DVD about our faith. That is a strengthening activity for any Knight. We can never learn enough about our Church. Another suggestion: visit a Vatican website and download a copy of Pope Francis' latest homily or talk -- these are so practical and aimed at bringing us believers to confront some of the major issues every person encounters in following Jesus Christ.

The Internet is such a valuable means to assist us in strengthening our faith. It is my intention to produce a daily Lenten reflection for Knights of the State of Maryland. These daily writings will cover a variety of topics but all designed to help you have a topic that can be discussed with your family each day of this coming Lent. A title for the site will be made in a week or two and, hopefully, a general announcement of the website will be distributed to all.

SUPREME COUNCIL NEWSwww.kofc.org**In Service to One, in Service to All****Cardinal George Receives Gaudium et Spes Award**

Cardinal Francis George, who served as archbishop of Chicago for more than 15 years until his retirement in 2014, received the Knights of Columbus' highest honor at a lunch in Chicago Jan. 30.

The Gaudium et Spes Award, named after the Second Vatican Council's pastoral constitution on the Church in the modern world, was established by the Knights of Columbus in 1992.

Cardinal George is the award's 11th honoree. Previous honorees have included Blessed Teresa of Kolkata, l'Arche founder Jean Vanier, Cardinal John O'Connor of New York, Cardinal Stanisław Dziwisz, and Cardinals William Baum and James Hickey, former archbishops of Washington.

Cardinal George has been a member of the Knights of Columbus since 1991. He has served as Knights of Columbus state chaplain for the state of Washington, in addition to host ordinary for the Knights of Columbus Supreme Convention in Chicago in 2005. The cardinal also presided over the Knights' Eucharistic Congress following that convention, and was a keynote speaker at the Knights of Columbus Supreme Conventions in 2002 and 2009.

Cardinal George's successor, Archbishop Blase Cupich, a member of the Knights of Columbus for more than three decades, gave the invocation. Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore, supreme chaplain of the Knights of Columbus, read the award's citation.

The citation reads in part: "He was the first Chicago native to shepherd the Church in the Windy City, the third largest archdiocese in the United States, which he led with grace, humility and intelligence. [...] For his courage and strength, and for his long and selfless service to the Church and her people, the Knights of Columbus is honored to pay tribute to a faithful shepherd and profound teacher of the faith by bestowing the eleventh Gaudium et Spes Award upon His Eminence Francis Cardinal George, Archbishop Emeritus of Chicago."

"The Cities of Yakima, Portland and Chicago were blessed to have Cardinal George as their bishop and spiritual leader. And his leadership has benefited not only those cities which he served, but the Knights of Columbus and Catholics across the United States," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson, who will present the award on Friday.

"In his brilliant speeches, homilies, letters and books, and in the brave witness to the faith that he has shown to the world — in sickness and in health — Cardinal George has proven over and over again one of the leading voices in the Catholic Church in the United States, and the Knights of Columbus is pleased to be able to honor him in this way for the great work he has done for so long," Anderson added.

Applications are due to the Faithful Comptroller of the Archbishop John Carroll Assembly no later than February 9. The Initiation Fee is \$70 and dress for the Exemplification is Tuxedo.
